Tapestry Update

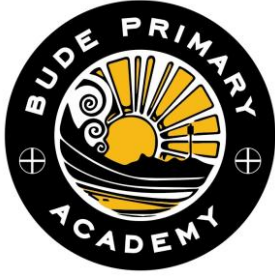

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Reading

It is recommended that you share a book with your child every day. This is essential as it helps children develop their love for reading. This could be an opportunity for you to discuss what is happening in the book with your child. In school, children are encouraged to choose books from the class library at their appropriate level. If your child is accessing Read Write Inc in school, they will bring home a book at their level to read at home.

Library books

We're excited to remind you that all children will have access to our own class library in Poppy Class as well as our whole-school library.

Home Learning

If appropriate, you can support your child at home by practicing their times tables. Pupils who know their times tables find all areas of maths far easier to approach and understand. Your child can access Numbots (number facts) or TTRockstars (times tables) through their personal logins which were shared at the start of this year. PE days – Thursday

Children should continue to come to school in their full PE kit, which comprises of:

- A turquoise PE T-shirt (optional, with embroidered school logo)
- Black shorts / leggings or joggers
- Trainers
- Our turquoise school jumper or cardigan

Please ensure children are dressed appropriately for the weather, with suncream applied at home in the morning and a sun hat for protection.

School Uniform Expectation

- Shoes – black shoes – no boots, heels or open toe

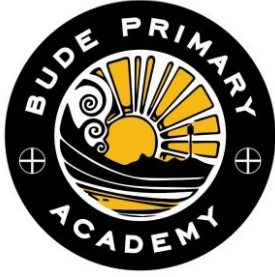
Reminders
