## Internet Safety - WhatsApp Safety Tip: Managing Group Invitations

Did you know you can control who is allowed to add you to WhatsApp groups? To help stay in control of your / your child's digital privacy, we recommend updating your settings so you aren't added to groups without your permission.



Simply go to Settings > Privacy > Groups and select "My Contacts." This ensures that only people you know can add you directly. If someone who isn't in your contacts tries to add you, they will have to send you a private invite link instead, giving you the choice to accept or decline. It only takes a moment to update and is a great way to manage notifications and privacy!



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## Small Acts, Big Impact

In our assemblies this half term, we are exploring the theme of **Responsibility** and our collective duty to protect the planet for future generations. We have been discussing the power of the 'ripple effect'—how one small act, such as picking up a single piece of litter at Summerleaze Beach, can inspire a chain reaction of positive change within our community.
